SNOW DAYS ARE eLEARNING DAYS

Learning is no longer lost to snow days. PAA's eLearning plans had been practiced in the early months of school so teachers and students alike were ready to continue classes when the snow hit town last month.

Teachers made an effort to keep assignments simple and meaningful. They varied from listening to podcasts, watching online videos, answering online quizzes, and writing essays. Attendance was measured through digital responses and all required by 4pm each day.

Confusions and miscommunications were anticipated so teachers stayed online and available to students while adapting to any bumps in the road. Challenges included time management, slow internet, and for a few students, access to digital devices. “We worked hard to ensure that all assignments were something students could do with what they have at home, not dependent on sophisticated technology or resources,” says Mechelle Peinado, PAA Vice Principal. “We also asked our teachers to keep assignments meaningful and reasonable.”

The majority of students enjoyed the novelty of the day and said they were impressed by fast responses from teachers. “When I had questions I got quick answers back,” said Devon Border-Freymuller, a junior.

“Mrs. Shim's English class was a really fun live-video chat,” says sophomore Lauren Viz-

carra. “She asked us questions about the chapters we were supposed to read. We could live text our answers or join the live feed. She even gave prizes away for correct answers. I got three candy bars!”

Freshmen, Olivia Slabbert and Kalani Kramer are neighbors so they joined each other for their P.E. assignment. “Mrs. Johnson assigned us 45 minutes of outside activity,” says Kramer. “And she gave bonus points for making a snowman!” Johnson's students documented their work through photos sent by text or email.

The good news: learning wasn't lost! But the BEST news is that our students, many of whom are inexperienced drivers, stayed off the icy roads.
