8. **Update from the ICC Team:** There are new mask options starting this week. Your ICC team is really excited to see that our state is nearing an important goal in this Covid-19 pandemic. It is amazing to think that our world was turned upside down just over a year ago by this brand new and little understood disease. We watched as various areas of our country and our world saw waves of Covid rates rise and fall. We even saw periods of time when our local hospitals were filling up and were struggling to manage all of the patients with various diseases in our state as Covid-19 added to an already busy healthcare system. Now, our infection rates are dropping rapidly. More and more people are being vaccinated. Our state has set a milestone for us to reach. Once 70% of people 18+ have received one dose of a Covid-19 vaccination, all of the Covid related mandates will come to an end. It is really exciting to realize that Washington County, as well as Multnomah County have been past 70% for some time now.

Our new mask options look like this: If you have been fully vaccinated, you are welcome to let one of our ICC members know. Once one of the ICC team members verifies that you have been vaccinated, you are welcome to remove your mask and participate in all church activities along with those who choose to continue to wear their mask. We will have one or two ICC members stationed in our church lobby on Sabbath. We will not ask you to verify your vaccination status unless you ask us to so that you may remove your mask. Please come to church wearing your mask and, if you choose, find one of your friendly ICC members to talk to about your vaccination status. There will be many of our church family members who continue to wear masks. There are many reasons to continue to do so. Please consider your situation carefully and choose what is best for you and your church family.

Once the state reaches the 70% threshold, we will no longer monitor masking or social distancing. At that point, the state is simply encouraging individuals to follow health organization recommendations (like the CDC and OHA). We continue to see many variants of Covid continue to arise. It may be best for you to continue to wear a mask, even after all of the state requirements have been lifted. If you have not been vaccinated or if you have any underlying health conditions that put you at greater risk of doing poorly if you come down with Covid, wearing a mask may be a good option for you when you are around others.
